## Program Philosophy

The Snow College Department of Natural Sciences, and participating agencies are basically concerned with the

management of our country's natural and agricultural resources. Historically, minorities and women have been under-represented in resource management careers. The goal of the camp is to expose members of these under-represented groups to the activities of these agencies in hopes of encouraging students to commit themselves to academic study and careers in math, science, natural resource management, and agriculture.

## Program Objectives

1. Identify students with serious interests in careers in math, science, natural resource management, and agriculture.
2. Familiarize students with college requirements to pursue a career in natural resources.
3. Help students to gain a greater awareness of career opportunities within natural resource management and agriculture.
4. Expose students to professionals in the fields of natural resources.
5. Provide information about college admissions procedures, financial aid, academic programs, and support service for diverse student populations at Snow College.

## Who May Apply?

Utah high school students who have a serious interest in the natural environment or the basic

sciences and who are undecided as to their career goals.

## How Much Will It Cost?

There is \$50 registration fee due upon acceptance to the camp. All other expenses, including meals, room and programs will be covered by the sponsoring agencies.

## How Will I Get There?

Students need to find their own transportation to the camp and back home.

## Who Will Be Chosen?

Applicants will be selected statewide on the basis of interest, background and ability. Those who are selected to attend the camp will be given more details by the sponsoring agencies.

## Participant Requirements

Selected students are required to follow camp rules, structured schedules, and to participate in all lessons, activities, field trips and demonstrations.
